Secondly, the allegation is not specific as to -- because the allegation against Sergeant Nowacki reads members of the Chicago Police Department, does not -- it is not specific to him. The allegation is also not specific as to the date, time, and location of the allegation of misconduct as required by the Collective Bargaining Agreement.


