SGT. JOHN BARTUCH: Rule 14 of the Chicago Police Department Rules and Regulations prohibits making false reports whether written or oral. You may be separated from the Chicago Police Department if you make a false report. Do you understand?

SGT. JOHN BARTUCH: Are you ready to give your statement at this time?

OFC. BIENVENIDO ACEVEDO: Yes.

I'm unaware -- I am not aware of any general order, policy, or directive from the Chicago Police Department that prohibits police officers from joining organizations, as long as those organizations are not in a criminal nature.

There is a concern that this is a First Amendment issue. We still have freedom of assembly, freedom of speech, that is being impinged upon based upon this investigation being conducted by AB. I want to be clear; I don't believe that it's these two Sergeants who are the ones that are spearheading this investigation. I think that this rot comes from a much higher place.

My bigger concern is, is that there is a -- the allegations stem from the news organizations. News organizations have requested that this CR be initiated. I don't believe that we should be in the practice of allowing news organizations, who request CRs, without any type of concrete evidence to go along with that. And with that, Officer Acevedo is going to read his compelled statement rights.

OFC. BIENVENIDO ACEVEDO: I would like to preface this statement by stating that I am not giving this statement voluntarily, but under

duress. I am only giving this statement, at this time, because I have been advised by the Chicago Police Department that if I do not give a statement, I will face disciplinary proceedings that will lead to termination of my employment.

On advice of counsel, I want to object to the delay in the investigation. This incident occurred approximately 12 years ago. This delay is prejudicial to my ability to clearly recall the details of this incident so that I may defend myself and provide a clear recitation of the facts.

And then I'm going to give you this, which just basically says by affixing your signature, you've acknowledged you have read and fully understood the above order given to you by me regarding the requested documents and acknowledge the date of delivery of said documents. TIM GRACE: We acknowledge the direct order. We believe this to be a legal order. I want to be clear; I don't believe these two Sergeants are the ones that are giving this order. I believe this is coming from high above.
